PPC MEMBERS EXTENDING APPOLOGIES

The meeting was called to order at 2:15 pm on February 3 2022. The PPC decisions for each item on the agenda is recorded below:

1. <u>PPC-2022-FED-001-DA Request by FED renewal of Oracle E-Business Suite Licenses.</u>

The PPC reviewed the submission and voted **to defer** the request.

A brief discussion was held by The PPC, Matthew Tibbetts, Theresa Walters, and Yahya Falsafi, concerning the procurement method, the different levels of support, and the use of the applications, value for money, and the purchase of the unlimited license agreement.

The FED Panel stated that the contract was owned by CSD, all negotiations were done by them, and that there were different updates and sets of license issued throughout the year.

The PPC deferred this application due to the Format of the Business Case, the value for money, as it relates to the Procurement Act, was being satisfied, no joint statement was produced from the entities involved, and also no detailed or alternative pricing was presented.

The FED panel was encouraged to rectify the application and resubmit the project.

2. <u>PPC-2021-PAHI-071-RFP Request by PAHI for the provision of consultancy services for a Fiber Optic Submarine Cable.</u>

The PPC reviewed the submission and voted **to approve** the request.

A brief discussion was held by The PPC, Carol Cooper and Miquel Jacques concerning the supplier, their technical expertise, the local impact, and the pricing.

3. PPC-2021-RCIP-057-RFP Request by RCIP for body armour.

The PPC reviewed the submission and voted **to approve** the request.

A brief discussion was held between The PPC, Jody-Ann Moore and Inspector Mark Coombe, concerning the high calibre body suits, the warranty, the pricing, the testing specifications, international standards, and service following delivery.

The PPC noted that there were two different suppliers for this project, and that the units had changed from 525 to 575.

4. PPC-2021-HSA-045-RFQ Request by HSA for pharmaceutical supplies.

The PPC reviewed the submission and voted **to defer** the request.

A brief discussion was held between The PPC, Dr Cummings, Colin Medford and Nadia Richards, concerning the procurement method and the pricing of the specialized drugs required by the HSA.

On March 3 2022 Mrs. Nadia Richards withdrew this submission with the promise to resubmit at a later date.
