Minutes of The Public Procurement Committee held February 6 2025, at 12.30 pm, in Conference Room #3028, Government Administration Building, 133 Elgin Avenue, George Town, Grand Cayman.

4. PPC Submissions Reviewed.

PPC-2025-FED-009-DA Request to renew Oracle Security and Software Support.

The PPC reviewed this submission and voted to approve this request on February 6 2025.

A brief discussion was held between The PPC, Matthew Tibbetts, Theresa Walters, and Yahya Falsafi concerning the background of the project.

The Panel stated that there was an increase in the contract price due to the renewal agreement only being for a twelve-month period, and that they would be liaising with the Computer Services Department on future contracts to strengthen negotiations and receive a better discount.

PPC-2024-PSPB-092-RFP PSPB request for IT Managed Service.

The PPC reviewed this submission and voted to approve this request on February 6 2025.

A brief discussion was held between The PPC, Ledra Lawrence and Whitney Dykeman, concerning the preferred bidder, scoring, and the rectification period.

PPC-2024-CIAA-040-RFP CIAA Security Screening Checkpoint Renovations.

The PPC reviewed this submission and voted to defer the request on February 6 2025.

A brief discussion was held between The PPC, Mark Whiteside, Nicholas Johnson, Eimer Powery, Chad Yates and William Manderson, concerning the preferred vendor, the budget, invites, site visits by potential bidders, and value for money.

The CIAA Panel stated that they did not send any invites and that out of the seventeen takers, only one potential bidder did a site visit. CIAA only had a six-month window to implement the program, and would lose the opportunity if it wasn't complete on time.

The Public Procurement Committee deferred the application pending the review of the schedule of prices contained in the bid by another Quantity Surveyor, in order to establish if best value for money was being obtained.
